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Cross-border Healthcare – Setting the Scene



Common challenges facing NHS systems are a growing aging population & budgetary constraints



Cross-border regions represent 40% of the territory of the EU; with 1 in 3 Europeans live in a border region.



EU-level cooperation: Council of the European Union in 2011 emphasised "the need to join forces and enter into more coordinated EU-level cooperation in order to support Member States"



EU Member States need to deepen cross-border healthcare cooperation, stimulate exchange of best practices and enhance the cohesion between border regions through the creation of an **EU cross-border mechanism**




Cross-border Cooperation under the CBHCD






HCP Members in ERNs



- Total EU Population 743,040,568 (2019) Higher population in Western EU MS
- 24 ERNs connecting 900 HCP Members in 300 Hospitals, across 26 Member States
- 24/24% ERN are coordinated by a western EU MS HCP Members
- 70% ERN HCP Members from 5 MS: France, Italy, Germany, The Netherlands and U.K.




Coverage per MS - Number of ERNs where the MS has at least 1 expert centre (unit)






Coverage per MS – ERNs per 1 million inhabitants

Number of Expert Centres in ERNs (Units) per 1 million inhabitants



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
Number of countries represented in each ERN



- Best one, has at least one HCP in 20 MS plenty of room for improvement
- Inequities in geographical distribution within some ERNs, for example EuroBloodnet has 21 Italian HCPs out of 65


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Real versus Ideal number of Expert Centres per country



Coordinators hypothesis: 1 Expert Centre per ERN per 10 million inhabitants or 1 centre per ERN in the smaller MS

In Summary:



- **European Reference Networks** are seen as the EU flag-ship initiative *European Parliament CBHCD Resolution*, 2019:
 - Further development and financing of the ERNs
 - Scaling up the ERN model up universal coverage of EU MS and all Rare Diseases
 - Expansion of the ERN model New Call for new ERNs
 - Need to establishing clear, transparent rules for patient referral between NHS & ERNs.
- Timeline for Expanding ERN Members (2019):
 - Affiliated partners MS to designate affiliated expert centres between Autumn 2018 Spring 2019
 - EC Call for New HCP Members estimated in May/June 2019
