



Preparation of the CEGRD recommendations on social care (ongoing)



- Mapping social services for RDs in Europe
- Preparing case studies and good practices
- Developing of definition for resource centres for RDs "one stop shop" services and starting to collect information on case management and integrated care
- Identifying main issues and hurdles regarding social care for RDs

INNOVCare - Call for proposals

- Call for proposals from EC-DG Employment (2014)
- Call "social policy innovation supporting reforms in social services" - specific focus on "one stop shop services" and "case handlers"
- Not specific to health/disability open to all vulnerable populations
- Over 200 projects submitted
- 7 selected led by public bodies in Spain (3), Italy (2),
 Netherlands (1) and Latvia (1)
- INNOVCare is the only project on health/disability and with European scope




INNOVCare - Objectives


- Assessment social unmet needs of people with a RD and their family
- Analysis of existing social care models in MS
- **Exchange of expertise/good practices** between national one-stop-shop services (resource centres)
- Proposition of a model of optimised patient social care pathway, integrating the national one-stop-shop service with regional case managers:
 - Implementation and evaluation of a **pilot** (Romania)
 - Analysis of **scaling opportunities** beyond RDs (to other diseases, disabilities) and to other MS
 - Assessment of the **economic impact and cost-benefit** of the care model
- Strengthening partnerships between public, private and civil society organisations providing social services to RD patients/families

- Leader of WP3 Communication; WP4 State of the Art of Social Care Provision and Patients/Families' needs; WP5 European Network of Resource Centres for Rare Diseases
- Collect data on patients'/families' needs (via Patient Voices) and on care pathways in MS
- Facilitate the establishment of the network of resource centres and the collection of good practices via network meetings
- Represent patients/users in coordination with our members
- Keep coherency between work packages
- Connect stakeholders
- Ensure the two way communication between INNOVCare and the rare disease community and advocacy actions




INNOVCare – WP4 State of the Art





INNOVCare - WP4 State of the Art

- Good practices






INNOVCare – WP4 State of the Art

Time frame: Sept-Oct 2016


Comparative study
