Features of the Technical Support Instrument

Uniqueness

Instrument brings expertise rather than funding to Member States, tapping into an EU wide pool of experts.

Demand-driven and light burden

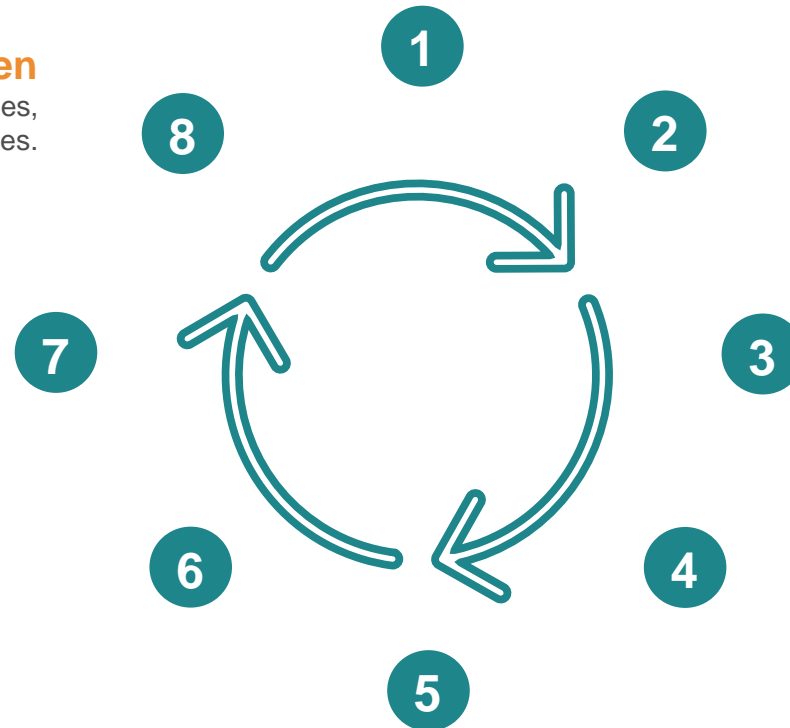
Demand-driven, burden-free for beneficiaries, and no co-financing for Member States.

Flexible and EU-wide

Address reform needs across policy areas and can easily be adapted to current and future challenges and crises.

Capacity building

Focus on strengthening the capacity of public administrations to design and implement reforms.



Tailor-made approach

The TSI consists of support on the ground, which is praised and increasingly demanded by the Member States given the tailor-made approach.

Accompanying Member States

Close involvement of DG REFORM staff: working together with the Member States authorities and the contracted providers in the delivery of the projects in all phases of project cycle management.

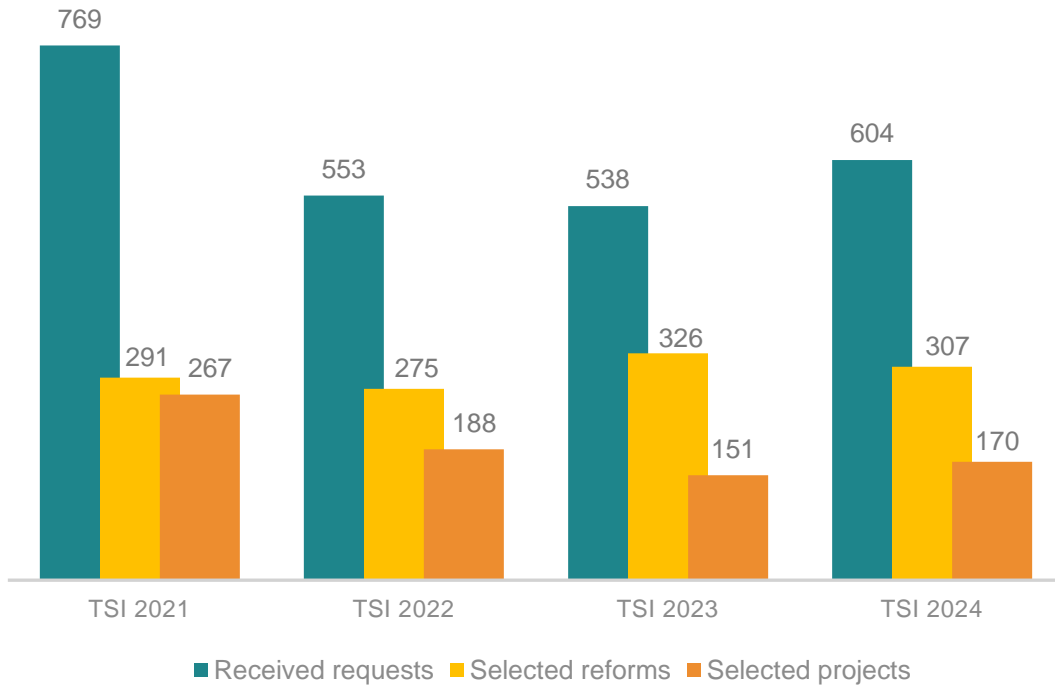
Independent

Not specifically linked to any other EU funds: TSI can provide support to any reforms independently of it being funded by EU or Member States.

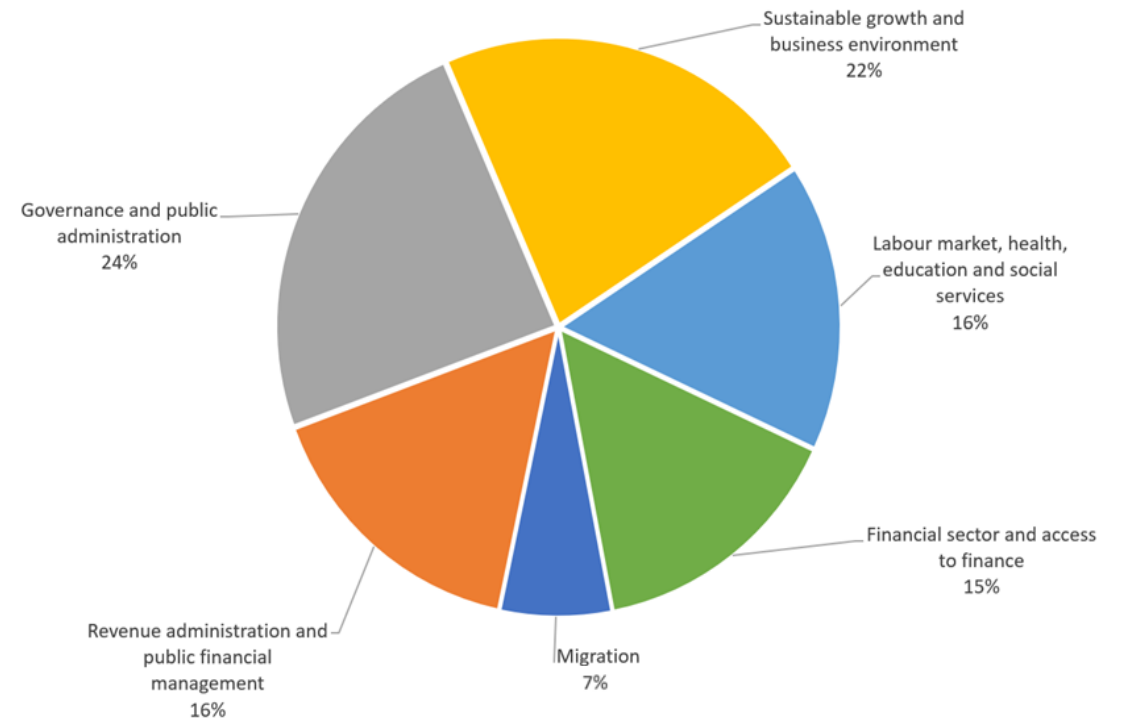
Largest instrument of technical support

TSI is the single largest instrument providing technical support to Member States in the MFF.

Over 780 projects contributing to close to 1200 reforms in all 27 Member States

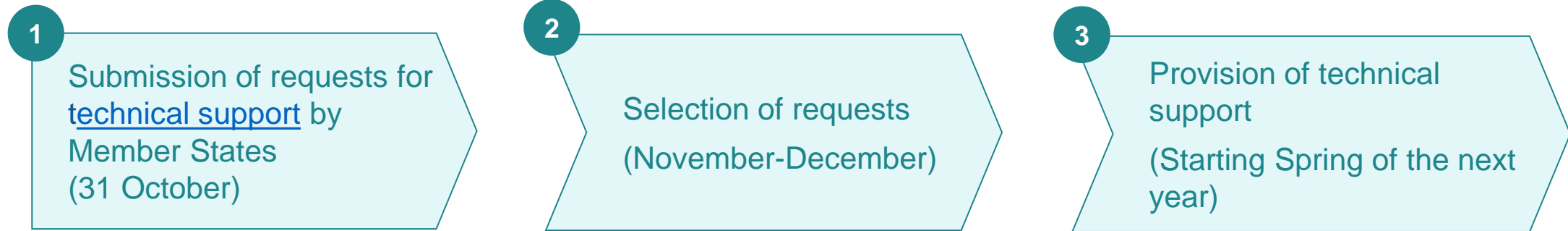

Flagship technical support projects

Definition

- Flagship technical support projects are **projects proactively proposed by DG REFORM** that:
 - Are **largely needed across Member States**
 - Meet a top **EU / Commission priority**
 - Are designed in a way that **can easily be fitted to various national contexts**
- Their uptake is **voluntary**

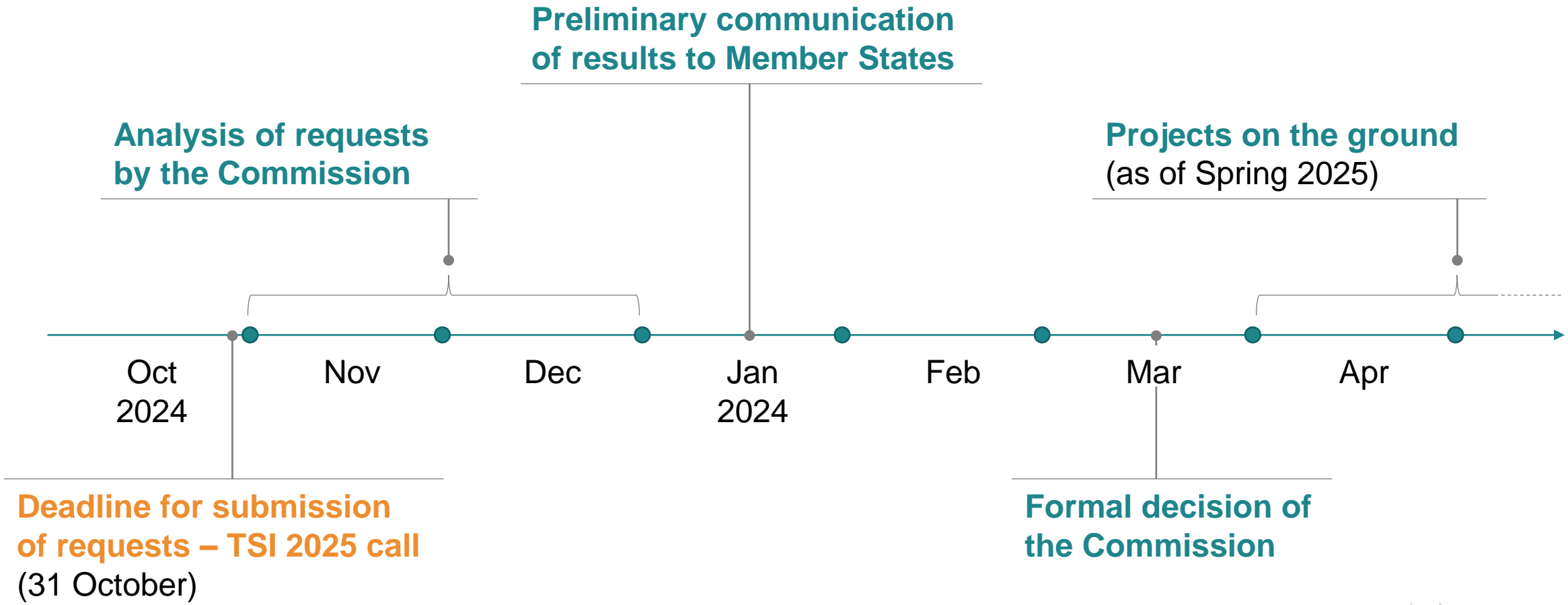

Selection of projects/Commission assessment

- **Assessment criteria** (set in TSI Regulation)
(urgency, breadth & depth, support needs, administrative capacity)
- Criteria related to **sound financial management**
(maturity, focus and expected results)
- **Prioritisation by the Member States**
- **Added value** and **impact** on the ground
- **Avoid overlaps** (the action proposed cannot be financed by other EU funding programmes)

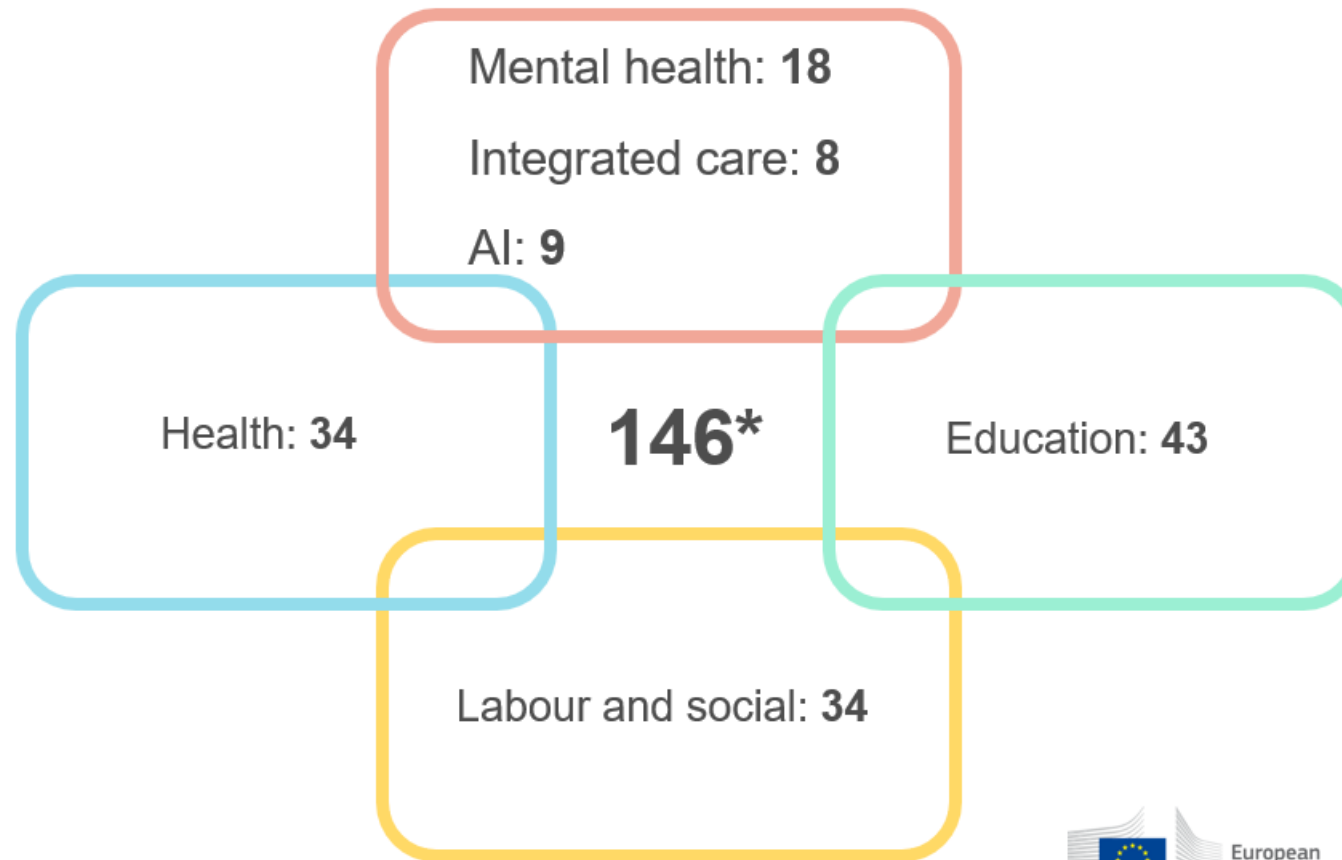


Timeline for TSI 2025

Past & current TSI support for HSPA



- Countries supported: Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania and Slovenia
- Project in preparation in Slovakia and Luxembourg
- Close cooperation and links with EU Expert Group on HSPA
- Informal Community of Practice established for exchange between countries and plans for workshops in 2025 & 2026

Portugal – genomic medicines

Request of:

- National Health Service (NHS)
- National Public Health institute (INSA)

Objective:

Develop/implement a national strategy for genomic medicine in Portugal – *project ending 1 August 2024*

Analysis of current role and potential of genomics in healthcare

Learning from EU/international good practice and expertise

Guidelines for a legal and ethical framework concerning genomic and health data in Portugal

Governance model for health and genomic information

Framework for the efficient organisation of clinical services, including data management, multidisciplinary teams, clinical networking and integration with research

Communication plan for the general public, patients and policymakers, focused on the potential and challenges of genomics for healthcare

TSI Health Hub Project – 2022-2024: EU Resources Hub for Sustainable Investing in Health

- Supporting 3 Member States – Austria, Belgium and Slovenia
- Total budget: EUR 2 400 000
- Workstream 1: Making the case for public investment in health
- Workstream 2: EU Health Resources Hub
- **Learning-by-doing** approach using 3 national pilot projects:
 - **AUSTRIA:** Greening of the Austrian Healthcare System
 - **BELGIUM:** Data integration for Population Health Management (PHM)
 - **SLOVENIA:** Strengthening access to primary healthcare
- **Untapped potential and opportunities** to facilitate access to EU funds and blend different instruments for maximal impact.

TSI Flagship 2025 EU Health Hub

Background - Optimising the use of EU Funds

2021 – Slovenian Presidency of the Council of the EU:

The Council invited the Commission to **explore setting up a dedicated health advisory service** to assist Member States upon request in **optimising the use of EU funds and tools** to support the planning, design, financing and implementation of needed health system reforms.

Existing funding landscape:

- Its complexity can obstruct access
- Health is **not** prominently featured across different instruments
- Need for more coordination and creating synergies

TSI Flagship 2025 EU Health Hub: Investing in Resilient Health Systems

Pillar 1: Quality spending

Analyse spending and data to estimate **attainable efficiency gains**

Review governance and formulate recommendations for improvement

Support the drafting of action plans, strategies and guidelines

Conduct training and capacity building activities for Member State authorities

Support development of monitoring and **evaluation mechanisms**

Pillar 2: Strategic investments

Support Health Ministries to **navigate and identify EU funds** and instruments

Test strategic investments in key areas (e.g. genomics, eHealth...)

Strengthen the **coordination between the national contact points** for EU funds

Conduct **training and capacity building** for authorities involved in health reform

- Design, implement, monitor and finance health reforms
- Maximise impact of EU support
- Foster mutual learning

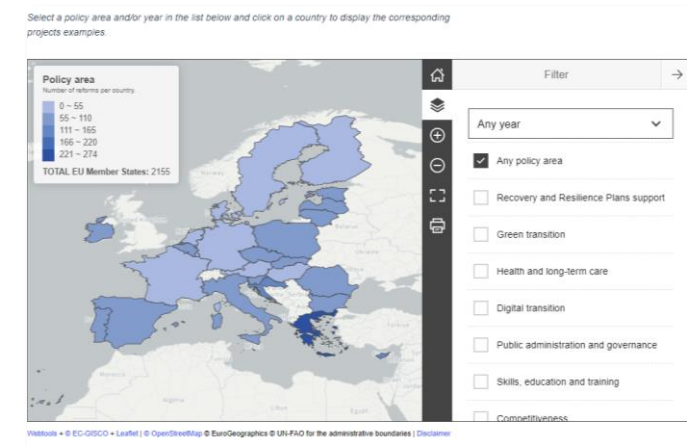

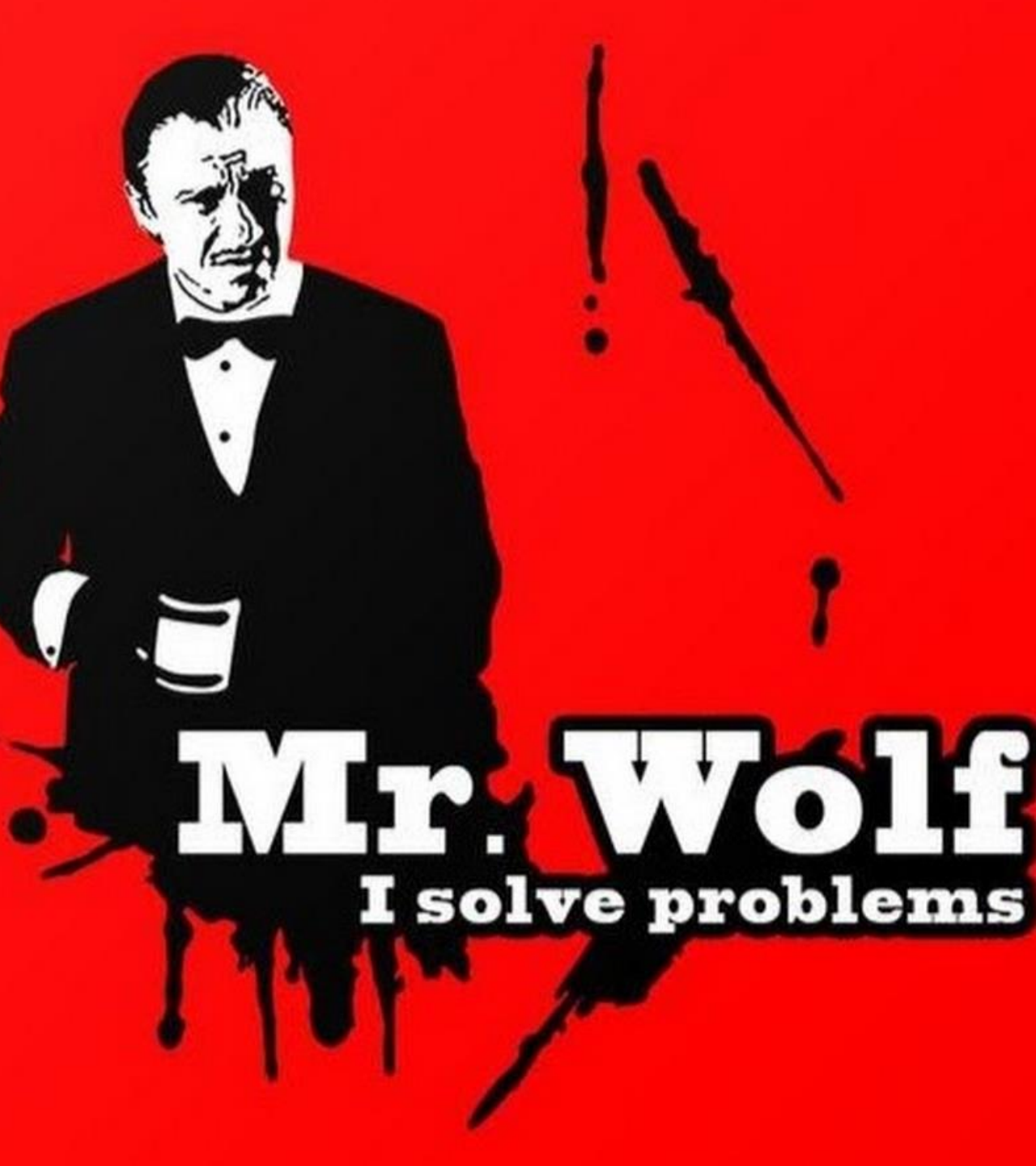
